- Physical features (natural geographical features/attractions)
- Human features (man-made attractions)
- Country flag/flower/animal
- Any other information you might think is interesting or important.

Again, it is up to you as to how you wish to present your information. Please can your topic homework be returned to school by Wednesday 22nd May (before hand, if completed earlier).

Each week I will continue to test spellings. Please practice the words sent home. I also ask that you read daily.
