We've launched our *Speak out. Stay safe.* programme so that a generation of children have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse and neglect. So far we've visited more than 15,000 primary schools – and we'd love your school to be next.

With the help of our mascot Buddy, the programme provides child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops delivered by specially trained staff and volunteers to help children:

- understand abuse in all its forms and recognise the signs of abuse
- know how to protect themselves from all forms of abuse
- know how to get help, and the sources of help available to them, including our Childline service.

By the end of our visit we know the children feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.
