Starting from Spring Term 2020 parents and carers will now be able to book their children's Clubs through the Arbor App.

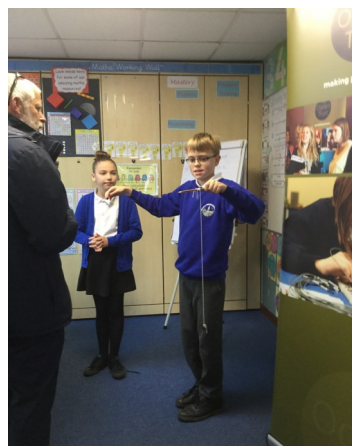

**making physics matter**



On Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> November, students from The Ogden Trust - St Austell Primary Partnership, got together for an afternoon of fun, where they participated in an assortment of physics busking activities. The St Austell Partnership is the first Primary school Partnership to run a busking session in the UK. Year 6 children from all 10 schools (St Stephen Churchtown Academy, Sandy Hill Academy, Truro Learning Academy, Bugle School, Probus Primary School, Penryn Primary Academy, Indian Queens Primary School, Treverbyn Academy, Whitemoor Academy, Shortlanesend School) in the partnership met at the hub school, St Stephen Churchtown Academy, and had the opportunity to experience an hour long 'circus' featuring a number of different experiments themed around physics topics. Sally Fulford, the SouthWest Ogden Trust regional rep, ran the session and children attending had resource boxes to bring back to their own schools. Each attending school will use the activities learned by nominating their Year 6 students as science ambassadors, who will run assemblies, teach other classes and run science booths at their respective Christmas and Science Fairs. Overall, an amazing afternoon had by all and there was definitely a buzz in the air about science!

## Sport

On Tuesday we travelled to Carclaze school for our first away matches of the season. Despite the sodden conditions, all five of our teams performed admirably.

Football A played out a tense and tight match against a very good Carclaze side. With the scores locked at 0-0 with less than a minute to go we unfortunately conceded a heartbreaking late goal. As we pushed forward in the dying seconds to try and retrieve the game, we were countered and gave away a penalty which was converted to leave the final score 2-0. The team deserve huge credit for their efforts and on another day could easily have come away with all the points.

Football B played another high energy and physical encounter in which they played very well but were unable to convert their chances - despite pressing hard until the end - finishing the game with a 0-0 draw. We are sure with a little more quality in front of goal they will soon turn their run of draws into a win.

Football 3/4 came out of the blocks quickly and created several chances before conceding a slightly calamitous goal due to a large puddle in the goal mouth. They continued to play well with Harrie equalising before half time. In the second half they were unfortunate to be hit on the break and concede two quick goals before Hayden pulled one back. They continued to push but and were unfortunate to get nothing out of the game.

Netball A continued their fine run of form and are now unbeaten in the large schools A league since the end of the 2017/18 season. They saw out another dominant 15-0 victory with all players contributing to the win.
