




Year 2 Autumn Term 1 2025/2026 Home learning outcomes- Readymoney and Fistral

History	Geography

Create a poster listing all the things you do to help others.	Can you create a news article or a story about good news in your home / family / friends.

Science - Animals, including humans	
Knowledge	Investigations
Do you have any pets at home? Draw and write about them and how you help to keep them healthy.	Measure the different people in your family. You could look at their hands, feet, height. What do you notice?

Maths- Place value and Addition
Practise drawing any 2-digit numbers, using tens and ones. Count on and back in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s. Read and write 2-digit numbers, using words and numbers.

Computing - Digital photography	
Take some photos of things that interest you. Show how you have improved your photo taking skill.	Use computers/technology to present another piece of homework.

PSHE- Team work and conflict resolution

Create 5 golden rules that you should follow for a happy place- it could be for school, home, or even the local area.	Who helps you? Draw a picture of them and write/show how they help you.

Music – Pulse, Rhythm and pitch	
Move to your favourite music- can you find the rhythm and move to it?	Instruments Do you play an instrument. Can you record yourself playing different rhythms?
