
Please practise these sound with your child at home.

Topic Book




Maths: Numbers

Next Weeks Learning:

Phonics

Phase 2 **i,n,m,d**

Investigations:

In line with our topic, 'Marvellous Me', children will begin to investigate themselves through their senses!

Starting with 'The Source of Sound' children will answer questions such as; Can you hear a sound? What is it? Where is it coming from? What does it sound like when you cover one ear?

Topic

Marvellous Me! Next week we will be sharing our All About Me boxes and looking at ourselves. We will be finding out things that are the same and things that are different, who has brown eyes or blue eyes.

Maths: Numbers

For the next week or so, we will be focusing primarily on getting the children settled by singing number songs and playing number games.

Number Sense:

Number Sense is different from the daily maths lessons in that it is a programme focused on developing children's number skills. In reception the children will start by learning to subitise.

Subitising means being able to instantaneously recognise a number of objects in a small group without needing to count them.
